# In a year, we hope to see the following progress on this strategic objective:

Our 2010-11 goal is to have 100% of students performing at P+ level on the district technology assessment.

#### PROGRESS SUMMARY

- 1. Enrolled all sixth grade students in a six-week Information Skills class and assessed students at the end of each class using district technology assessment.
- 2. Enrolled any seventh or eighth grade student who was not proficient on district technology assessment, in an information skills class or technology class and reassessed their progress after the class.
- 3. All eighth grade students completed the state mandated technology assessment.
- 4. All teachers taught technology vocabulary within their curricular area. This stategic objective will continue in the 2011-12 school year.
- 5. All teacher incorporated technology into their academic units. The computer labs were used almost 100% of the time. Next year, sixth grade will have a complete computer lab in the sixth grade classroom wing. Seventh and eighth grade will share one full lab and a third lab will not be a full lab, but will have 15 computers set up in the lab.
- 6. Technology teacher and Information Skills teachers met as a group to review the technology standards and adjusted the curriculum guides for all technology and info skills classes.
- 7. All incoming sixth grade students fall 2011 will be expected to keyboard 30 words a minute by the time they leave middle school spring of 2014. This expectation was shared with all incoming sixth grade parents at the spring registration meeting.
